

Blackjack

Blackjack also known as "21" is a table game that players may bet \$1.00 to \$10.00 per hand, it is played with a six deck shoe. Players may play multiple hands if spots are available.

At the start of a game the dealer will inspect each deck to be sure all decks are complete and not damaged. The dealer will next wash each deck face up to insure the cards are mixed. After the dealer shuffles all six decks a player will cut the cards. The player must cut at least one deck on from the front or back of the combination deck. After the player cuts the cards the dealer will re-cut the back of the deck to protect the shoe. When the dealer re-cuts the shoe, it must be at least one full deck.

The main objective of Blackjack is to come as close to 21 as possible without going over.

If a player goes over at anytime the dealer will take the bet first and take the cards second.

The dealer must hit (take a card) when they have sixteen or less. The dealer must also hit on a soft seventeen a soft hand is any hand that can be hit and not bust, ex, if the dealer has ace, ace, three, two the total is seventeen but it is considered soft so the dealer must hit. If the dealer busts then all players that have a live hand will get paid for each bet they have posted.

The dealer gives each player who has posted a bet, two cards face up. The dealer also gets two cards with one of them face up.

If a player gets an ace and ten/face card showing he will pay that player 3/2 or 1.5 times their bet.

If the dealer has an ace showing the dealer will offer insurance or even money to all players. If a player has blackjack they can take even money at that time. Players that do not have a blackjack may insure their hand for up to half their bet.

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If the dealer has blackjack the dealer will turn over the hand immediately, take all players bets that do not also have blackjack, players with blackjack will receive a push. The player that bought insurance will receive 2/1 for their insurance bet.

If the dealer has a ten showing the dealer will check for blackjack at that time. Without asking the players if they would like insurance or even money.

After checking for blackjack, action begins starting at the dealer left each player has the chance to hit, split, double down or stay. A player may split any matching cards by putting up an additional bet. The player may also split any face cards including tens. Players may split up to three times and play up to a four hand total. If a player chooses to split aces he or she will only receive one card per ace. If the player receives a third ace when splitting, then the player may not re-split aces.

A player may double down on the first two cards. When a player doubles down they put up a second bet and receive only one card. A player may double down for the equal amount of the base bet.

If the dealer and player have the same hand it is considered a push. When a player pushes on a single bet they keep the money they have bet.

If a player splits and pushes both hands they keep the money they have bet on both hands. At the end of the night the manager tells the dealer when he or she is shuffling the last shoe; the dealer notifies the players that when the shoe is complete the table will be closed. When the dealer reached the cut card that is the last hand for the shoe. The dealer will re-suit all the decks to insure that all cards are still there. The trays and rakes are taken to the cage and counted.

Players are permitted to play more than one hand at one time at the same table. In the event there are additional customers waiting to play the most recent player playing multiple hands will be forced to give up one betting spot at the end of the shoe to allow the new player to play.

21+3 Blackjack

Game Objective:

There are 2 wagers to 21+3 Blackjack. You must play conventional Blackjack in order to bet on any Bonus wagers. The objective of conventional Blackjack is to achieve a total greater than the dealer, without going over 21. The other wager is the 21+3 Bonus Wager in which the objective is to match a three card poker hand (player's two cards with the dealer's up card) with its Pay Table.

Game Rules:

Conventional Blackjack Rules (Primary Wager)

- Split any pair
- Double after split allowed
- Double on any two cards
- Blackjacks pay 3 to 2 or 2 to 1 as posted
- Dealer hits a soft 17

21+3 Blackjack

21+3 is a house-banked, optional blackjack bonus wager. The game can be played with 6-8 standard 52 card decks of playing cards. The proposition wagers are based on a 3-card hand using the dealer's one (1) up card and the player's two (2) initial up cards to form a 3-card poker hand. The outcome of the primary blackjack wager has no bearing on the 21+3 bonus wager and vice versa. No wager will exceed \$10 per spot.

Equipment:

Standard Casino Table

21+3 felt layout with payout charts printed on felt

Standard 52 card decks

Cut Card

Cash value gaming chips

1: Prior to the start of each round of blackjack play, players may optionally make a 21+3 wager with their primary blackjack wager between \$1 and \$10. Players must make a primary blackjack wager and cannot make a 21+3 wager only. The 21+3 wager is placed on the designated spot on the table layout at the same time their primary blackjack wager is made and before any cards are dealt.

2: After all wagers have been placed, the dealer deals two cards, face up, to each participating player, and to themselves in the same manner as regular blackjack 1 card face up and 1 card face down for the dealer.

3: Once the dealer has dealt two cards to each player and two cards to themselves (1 up, 1 down), the dealer must determine if any players who have made the 21+3 wager have achieved a winning hand.

4: Beginning from the dealer's right to left, in counterclockwise rotation, the dealer takes all losing 21+3 wagers and pays all winning 21+3 wagers. All payouts and original 21+3 wagers should be removed from the betting area once the player(s) have been paid.

5: In the event the dealer's up card is an ace, the dealer will reconcile all 21+3 wagers prior to asking for insurance or checking their hand for a blackjack.

6: once all 21+3 wagers have been reconciled, regular blackjack dealing procedures resume. See payout chart below.

If there is an incorrect number of cards in any hand all hands are void and the cards are washed and reshuffled.
