

Blackjack with Match Up and 3 Card Bonuses

Object of the game: to achieve a higher card score than the dealer without going over 21.

The Match Up Bonus is based on either of the player's card matching the 'up' card of the dealer prior to the start of the game.

The 3 Card Bonus is based on a 3-card hand using the dealer's one (1) up card and the player's two (2) initial up cards to form a 3-card poker hand.

The outcome of the primary blackjack wager has no bearing on the either of the bonus wagers and vice versa.

Blackjack wagers: \$ 2, 4, 6, 8 or 10 as indicated on the table placard.

Bonus wagers: \$1 to \$10

Equipment:

Standard Casino Table

6 Standard 52 card decks

Cut card

Cash value gaming chips

Game Rules:

1. Blackjack will be played with 6 decks of 52 cards.
2. Bets will be \$2, \$4, \$6, \$8 or \$10 as indicated on the table placard.
3. Prior to the start of each round of blackjack play, players may optionally make a match up and/or a 3-card bonus wager in combination with their primary blackjack wager. Players must make a primary blackjack wager to receive cards and may not place only the bonus wagers. All wagers must be placed before any cards are dealt.
4. Aces may be counted as 1 or 11, 2 to 9 according to face value, 10s and face cards count as 10.
5. After the players have bet, the dealer will deal 2 cards, one at a time, to each player and to himself. One of the dealer cards is dealt face up. The face down card is called the hold card.
6. Once the dealer has dealt two cards to each player and two cards to themselves (1 up, 1 down), the dealer must determine if any players who have made bonus wagers have winning combinations.
7. Beginning from the dealer's right to left, in counterclockwise rotation, the dealer resolves all bonus wagers prior to playing out the blackjack portion of the game.
8. In the event the dealer's up card is an Ace, the dealer will reconcile all bonus wagers prior to asking for Insurance or checking their hand for a blackjack.

9. The value of the hand is the sum of the point values of the individual cards. Blackjack is the highest hand and consists of an Ace and a 10-point card and it outranks all other 21-point hands.
10. If the dealer has an Ace showing, he will offer a side bet called insurance. The side wager pays 2 to 1 if the dealers hold card is any 10-point card. Insurance wagers are optional, must be at least \$1 and may not exceed half the original wager.
11. If the dealer has a 10 or an Ace showing, he will peek at his face down card to see if he has Blackjack. If he does, he will turn it over immediately.
12. If the dealer has a blackjack, all wagers except insurance, will lose, unless the player also has Blackjack which then results in a push. The dealer will resolve all insurance wagers at this time.
13. Play begins with the player to the dealers left. The following are the choices available to the player:
 - a. Stand: player stands pat with his cards
 - b. Hit: player draws another card (more if he wishes). If the card causes the players total point value to exceed 21 (break/bust), he loses
 - c. Double: player doubles his bet and gets one, and only one, more card.
 - d. Split: If the player has a pair or any 2 10-point cards, then he may double his bet and separate his cards into two individual hands. The separate hands will be played out one at a time, with the dealer giving cards as requested by player (stand, hit, double or split again (up to four times)). When splitting Aces, each Ace automatically receives only one card – player may not hit. If the player gets a 10 and an Ace after splitting, the hand value is 21, not Blackjack. Aces may only be split once.
 - e. Surrender: will not be allowed.
14. After each player has had his turn, the dealer will turn over his hold card. If the dealer has 16 or less, he will draw another card. When the dealer has a soft 17 (Ace and 1 or 2 other cards that adds up to 17), the dealer will hit until at least hard 17 or bust.
15. If the dealer goes over 21 points (bust), any player who didn't already bust will win.
16. If the dealer does not bust, then the higher point total between each player and the dealer will win.
17. Winning wagers pay even money, except a winning player Blackjack will pay 3 to 2.

2 Suited Matches	20 to 1
1 Suited/1 Unsuitd Match	15 to 1
1 Suited Match	10 to 1
2 Unsuitd Matches	5 to 1
1 Unsuitd Match	3 to 1
