No Limit Texas Hold'em

We offer limit and No limit poker. Cash poker is played with cash value chips. A player may not buy in for more than \$150 at the table.

The dealer will spread the standard 52 card deck, ensuring that the deck is complete. The dealer will then wash the deck, face up and will execute the standard shuffling procedure; square the cards with the deck facing the players, then riffle, riffle, box (strip the deck in quarters), riffle, then cut the deck with one hand forward on to the cut card. The dealer will establish the "dealer button" by high card rank, with ties resolved by reverse alphabetical suit (spade, heart, diamond & club). Once small blind and large blind are posted, the dealer can begin to deal.

No Limit Texas Hold'em begins with a small blind and big blind. For this example, I will use the most common version we play (\$1/\$2 No limit). In \$1/2 N.L. the blinds are \$1 small blind and \$2 for the big blind. All players are dealt two-hole cards. They need to make their best 5-card hand using any of the 5 community cards and their two-hole cards. After the cards are dealt the player directly following the big blind can fold, call the big blind for \$2 or raise any amount up to what they have on the table in poker chips prior to the start of the hand. Cash on the table does not play. Cash must be exchanged for chip prior to the start of the hand. At no time during a hand can a player take out more money for that hand. No limit Texas Hold'em can be played using different blind amounts, \$1/\$2, \$2/\$4, \$2/\$5, \$3/\$6, \$4/\$8 and \$5/\$10. No forced bet or blind amount will exceed the \$10 MAX BET. No buy-in will exceed \$150 at the table.

1. If a player leaves the table and misses a round of blinds, they will be issued a small blind and large blind chip, in order to begin play again they will have to post both missed blinds. If a player is gone from the table for more than 25 minutes their chips be removed from the table

and subsequently held for the customer at the cage. Chips are to be counted and verified in front of the table.

- 2. When a player is at the table and asks for a seat change, they do not have to re-post if they are moving 3 seats or less away ("three for free"). If a table breaks and players are moved to a new table, they will not be required to post to get dealt into the game.
- 3. Buying the button: A player is allowed to come into the small blind if they buy the button for \$3 (big and small blinds)
- 4. Players will not be allowed to take chips off the table during their playing session. If a player is caught redeeming chips, they will be asked to put the money on the table as live action money. If the player takes chips off the table, they will be asked to put them back. Players are allowed to use chips at the table to purchase beverages from the wait staff. Lastly, players are not allowed to give chips to another person. If the player refuses to comply, they will be put on a 30-minute penalty. Cash on the table does not play. Cash must be exchanged for chips prior to the start of the hand.

Cash Game Rake Procedure:

The dealer is responsible for the rake. The rake is up to 10% of the total pot up to a maximum of \$5.00 at \$50.00. The dealer will continue to pull the percentage out of the pot in between betting rounds and place it on top of the rake drop box slot until the hand is completed then deposit the rake before the start of the next shuffle. Once the hand is over and the pot has been awarded the dealer is to drop the rake into the drop box. If the dealer is challenged on the amount being raked, they are authorized to stack and count out the total pot and verify if the percentage is correct. If it is incorrect in the favor of the customer, monies will be returned to the pot, if it is incorrect in the favor of the house that may be corrected as well.

Reload and Chip Sales:

The manager in the section will re-load the trays of the dealers when needed. The chips will be released to the manager by the cage and recorded. The manager then issues the chips to the dealer. They immediately verify the chips and enter them into their tray inventory. If the dealer runs out or is low on chips then the proper floor call is, "Reload" and table number.

2. Texas Hold'em

The dealer will spread the standard 52 card deck, ensuring that the deck is complete. The dealer will then wash the deck, face up and will execute the standard shuffling procedure; square the cards with the deck facing the players, then riffle, riffle, box (strip the deck in quarters), riffle, then cut the deck with one hand forward on to the cut card. The dealer will establish the "dealer button" by high card rank, with ties resolved by reverse alphabetical suit

(spade, heart, diamond & club). Once small blind and large blind are posted, the dealer can begin to deal.

In "Limit" Texas Hold'em the players must follow the table betting limit. Each game will begin with a set betting structure. Players are not allowed to bet anything other than the predetermined amount. If it is a \$5/\$10 limit game the blinds as describe above will be set at \$2 for the small blind and \$5 for the big blind. After the cards are dealt the player directedly following the big blind will have an option: He can fold his cards, call the \$5 big blind to stay in the hand or raise to \$10. Players can not bet any other amount than described.

When the first betting round is complete the dealer will put up a flop of 3 community cards. Betting will start at the first player directly following the dealer button. Said player only has 2 options they can check (not folding or betting) or they can bet \$5. The next player has the option to check(provided the first player checked), fold if the first player bet \$5, call the \$5 if there was a bet or raise to \$10 if there was a bet. When action is complete the dealer will put out the turn. The turn is the fourth community card. Betting on the turn is in \$10 increments. Lastly the dealer will put down the river. The betting on the river is also in \$10 increments. When action is complete the deal will give the best 5 card hand the pot.

LIMIT Texas Hold'em can be played using different blind amounts, \$1/\$2, \$2/\$4, \$3/\$6, \$2/\$5, \$4/\$8 and \$5/\$10. No forced bet or blind amount will exceed the \$10 MAX BET. No buy-in will exceed \$150 at the table.

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3.Omaha

The dealer will establish the "dealer button" by high card rank, with ties resolved by reverse alphabetical suit (spade, heart, diamond & club). Once small blind and large blind are posted, the dealer can begin to deal.

In Omaha the players are still trying to get their best 5 card hand. The major difference in Omaha is that the players are dealt four-hole cards instead of 2 as in Texas Hold'em. The player must always use two of the four cards in their hand. The dealer puts a 5-card community board out during play. The player makes their best 5 card hand using 2 of their hole cards and 3 of the community cards. The community cards are dealt out just like Texas Hold'em: a 3-card flop, 1 card on the turn and the last card on the river.

Omaha can be play limit, pot limit or no limit and it can be played using different blind amounts, \$1/\$2, \$2/\$4, \$3/\$6, \$2/\$5, \$4/\$8 and \$5/\$10. No forced bet or blind amount will exceed the \$10 MAX BET. No buy-in will exceed \$150 at the table.
