

New Hampshire Hold'Em with 3-Card Bonus

The name of the card game:

New Hampshire Hold'Em with 3-Card Bonus

The object of the card game:

The objective of New Hampshire Hold'Em is to compile the highest 5-card poker hand (containing at least a pair of 6's) from the 2 cards dealt to the player and the 3 communal cards.

The rules of the card game:

New Hampshire Hold'Em is a game in which players do not compete against other players or the dealer, but rather against a pay table to build the best 5-card poker hand possible using the player's 2 cards and the 3 communal cards.

New Hampshire Hold'Em allows players to handle cards, however the cards must stay above the table at all times; failure to do so will lead to immediate reprimand by the dealer. Players are allowed to show their cards to other players prior to the end of betting action. Even though other players appreciate the information, players are not required to show their cards until all communal cards have been revealed. While handling their cards players must be seated in a provided chair unless management has given verbal exception for disability reasons or other circumstances.

New Hampshire Hold'Em provides players with numerous chances to win during four different stages of betting. Posting after action has closed on a particular bet is not permissible, is cheating, and is punishable by law as stealing from a charity, potentially a felony in the state of New Hampshire.

Equipment Used:

- Standard gaming table including a chip well, a cash drop box and plastic mallet
- Gaming chairs
- New Hampshire Hold'Em layout with 3-Card Bonus
- Two separate distinguishable decks of 52 cards
- Cut card
- Discard rack
- Gaming chips

The method of play for the card game:

Dealer shuffles a 52 card deck.

To begin the game, players must make an Ante bet.

Working from left to right, the dealer makes two passes around the table, and deals each player a starting card, then another. Cards are dealt face up for COVID-19 safety precautions, unless specifically requested by a customer.

After looking at their two cards, prior to the "Flop" community card, players have a choice:

- Fold (and surrender their Ante); or
- Make a bet in the designated betting circle under “Flop”, along with optional raise and re-raise bets, all of which must be equal to their Ante.

The dealer then burns a card and deals the first community card face-up, called the Flop.

After the “Flop” community card and prior to the “Turn” community card, players have a choice:

- Fold (and surrender their Ante and Flop bets); or
- Make a bet in the designated betting circle under “Turn”, along with optional raise and re-raise bets, all of which must be equal to their Ante.

The dealer then burns a card and deals the second community card face-up, called the Turn.

After the “Turn” community card and prior to the “River” community card, players have a choice:

- Fold (and surrender their Ante, Flop, and Turn bets); or
- Make a bet in the designated betting circle under “River”, along with optional raise and re-raise bets, all of which must be equal to their Ante.

The dealer then burns a card and deals the third community card face-up, called the River.

Determined by the three community cards (Flop, Turn and River), if at least a pair is not achieved, then the dealer collects all losing 3-Card bonus bets.

Working from right to left, the dealer tables (reveals) all player hands that have not been folded or tabled by the player themselves. The player’s 2 starting cards and the 3 community cards (Flop, Turn, and River) are used to create a 5-card poker hand. If the player’s hand is not better than a pair of 6s, then the dealer collects all remaining bets.

Once all losing bets are collected, if the 3-Card bonus bet is a winner, the dealer then pays all 3-Card Bonus bets, from right to left, based on New Hampshire Hold’Em Pay Table 2.

After the 3-Card Bonus bet payouts are complete, the dealer pays from right to left based on the highest strength of hand achieved by the player’s 5-card poker hand according to New Hampshire Hold’Em Pay Table 1. All winning bets, excluding the 3-Card Bonus, receive the same odds payouts.

Flop Bet

3-Card Bonus

Wager Amounts:

Ante: \$2 - \$10

3-Card Bonus: \$1 - \$10, wager cannot exceed Ante wager

All Other Bets: \$2 - \$10, wager must be equal to Ante wager
