New Hampshire Hold 'Em Table Game



Object of the game:

The players will combine their two hole cards with the dealer's three community cards in an effort to make a pair of sevens or better.

Rules of the game:

The dealer will switch between two decks each hand, washing and shuffling the deck before use.

The game will be dealt from left to right, each player receiving one card at a time, until all players at the table have two facedown cards. These hole cards must be kept private by the player who receives them.

Once a player places their last bet, the cards must be placed in front of their chips. From this point on, only the dealer may touch the cards.

Any hand of three of a kind or better (refer to the payouts section) will be called out by the dealer and acknowledged by the floor manager.

Equipment to be used:

The dealer will have two standard 52 card decks, a rack of chips available for players to purchase, and a tray of chips that will be used for payouts.

New Hampshire Hold 'Em Method of play

Players make an ante wager. All other bets must match this ante bet.

The dealer gives each player two cards face down. Players may, and should, examine their cards. Each player's hole cards must remain concealed from other players at the table.

Player's may either fold or make a "flop" bet. Players also have the option to make to add two additional "flop" bets.

The "flop", or first community card, is turned over in front of the dealer.

Player's may either fold or make a "turn" bet. Players also have the option to make to add two additional "turn" bets.

The "turn", or second community card, is turned over in front of the dealer.

Player's may either fold or make a "river" bet. Players also have the option to make to add two additional "river" bets.

The River, or third community card, is turned over in front of the dealer.

All wagers paid according to the following pay table included in the payouts section.

Types of Wagers for the game/Wager amount for the game:

Players are free to wager either \$2, \$5 or \$10 dollar on their ante space to receive cards. Every other bet placed must match this initial bet. Players must place one and can place up to three bets to see the flop, turn and river cards.

There are two bonus bets available, a Pair Plus bonus, in which the player will be paid according to the dealers 3 "flop, turn and river" cards independently of their hole cards, and a '6 card bonus wager' which will combine the players two down cards with four separate cards, basically making an entire second hand for one wager.

Payouts per player per hand will not exceed \$1,000 on \$2 bets, or \$2,000 on \$4 bets, \$2,500 on \$5 bets, and \$5000 on \$10 bets.
