

ROULETTE

The name of the casino table game:

Roulette

The object of the game:

To correctly predict the outcome of a ball falling into a numbered compartment of a spinning wheel.

The rules of the game:

All wagers at Roulette shall be made with Roulette chips on the appropriate areas of the Roulette layout.

A player must either buy value chips or Roulette-specific chips from the dealer or alert the dealer and be granted permission to introduce value chips to the board. No player shall be issued or permitted to wager Roulette-specific or value chips which are identical in color and design to chips being used by another person at that same table. Roulette-specific chips must stay on or above the Roulette table at all times. If Roulette-specific chips are removed from the table and need to be returned at any value other than \$1, then the floor manager must be called.

Each player shall be responsible for the correct position of their wager on the Roulette layout regardless of whether they are assisted by the dealer. Each player must ensure that any instructions he or she gives to the dealer regarding the placement of a wager are correctly carried out.

Each wager shall be settled strictly in accordance with its position on the layout when the ball falls to rest in a compartment of the wheel.

Betting in any manner once the dealer has called “No More Bets” is Past Posting, is not allowed, and will be addressed appropriately by the dealer and/or floor manager.

The equipment used for the game:

- Roulette gaming table including cash drop box and plastic paddle
- Roulette wheel – balanced and checked regularly
- 2 different sized Roulette balls
- Dolly (clear plastic marker used to mark the outcome of the spin on the board)
- Differentiable sets of Roulette-specific chips
- Chips to denominate Roulette-specific chips
- Plastic tray to hold Roulette-specific chips, value chips, and denomination chips
- Value chips
- Electronic outcome reader board (optional)

The method of play for the game:

Rotation of Wheel and Ball:

- (1) The Roulette ball shall be spun by the dealer in a direction opposite to the rotation of the wheel and shall complete at least three revolutions around the track of the wheel to constitute a valid spin.
- (2) While the ball is still rotating in the track around the wheel, the dealer shall call “No More Bets” as the ball is slowing down.
- (3) Upon the ball coming to rest in a compartment, the dealer shall announce the number of such compartment and shall place a point marker to be known as a “dolly” or “crown” on that number on the Roulette layout.
- (4) After placing the dolly on the layout, the dealer shall first collect all losing wagers and then pay all winning wagers according to the Roulette Pay Table below.

Placement of Bets:

- (1) If the table is just being opened the dealer will announce the opening of the game.
- (2) Upon completion of the payouts from the previous spin, the dealer will remove the dolly and announce that the board is open for players to place their bets.
- (3) Dealers are there to assist players with the placement of bets, yet players are responsible that their chips are placed in the correct location. Dealers cannot take chips directly from players’ hands; rather, they must be placed on the table before transferring possession.
- (4) Players can continue to bet once the dealer has spun the ball. The dealer will announce “No More Bets” before the ball has begun to fall while waving their hand from top to bottom over the board to indicate the close of betting.

Roulette Irregularities:

- (1) If the ball is spun in the same direction as the wheel, the dealer shall announce “No Spin” and shall attempt to remove the Roulette ball from the wheel prior to it coming to rest in one of the compartments.
- (2) If the Roulette ball does not complete three revolutions around the track of the wheel, the dealer shall announce “No Spin” and shall attempt to remove the ball from the wheel prior to it coming to rest in one of the compartments.
- (3) If a foreign object enters the wheel prior to the ball coming to rest, the dealer shall announce “No Spin” and shall attempt to remove the ball from the wheel prior to it coming to rest in any one of the compartments.
- (4) If a player attempts to place a wager after the dealer states “No More Bets” the late bet will not be honored and will be returned to the player at that time. However, the spin will still be honored to all players who place their bets within the betting time frame. This is Past Posting and will be addressed accordingly by casino management.
- (5) If the ball hangs on the edge of the Roulette wheel and does not fall in a timely manner, the dealer shall call floor. If the ball continues to hang, the floor manager will announce “No Spin” and the dealer shall attempt to remove the ball from the wheel prior to it coming to rest in any one of the compartments. If the ball falls into a compartment before the floor manager arrives, or calls “No Spin,” then it shall constitute as a legal spin.

The types of wager or wagers for the game:

1. "Straight" is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in the compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to a single number selected by the player. The player shall select a number by placing a wager within the box on the Roulette layout that contains the selected number.
2. "Split" is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to either of two numbers selected by the player. The player shall select the numbers by placing a wager on the line between the two boxes on the Roulette layout that contain the two selected numbers, except that a split wager on "0" and "00" may also be placed on the line between the "2nd 12" box and the "3rd 12" box called the courtesy line.
3. "Three numbers" (also called street) is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of three numbers in a single row on the Roulette layout selected by the player. The player shall select a row of numbers by placing a wager on the outside line of the box on the Roulette layout that contains the first number in the selected row.
 - a. "Three numbers" shall also include a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of the three numbers contained in one of the following groups of numbers: "0", "1", and "2"; "0", "2", and "00"; or "00", "2", and "3".
 - b. The player shall select one of the "three numbers" wagers identified above in section 3(a) by placing a wager on the common corner of the three boxes containing the selected numbers.
4. "Four numbers" (also referred to as four corners) is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of four numbers in contiguous boxes on the Roulette layout selected by the player. The player shall select the four numbers by placing a wager on the common corner of the four boxes containing the selected numbers.
5. "First five numbers" (also referred to as the hot corner) is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of the numbers "0", "00", "1", "2", or "3". The player shall bet on the "first five numbers" by placing a wager on the common corner of the boxes on the Roulette layout that contains the label "1st 12" and the numbers "0" and "1".
6. "Six numbers" (also called double street) is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of six numbers contained in two contiguous rows of numbers on the Roulette layout selected by the player. The player shall select the two rows of numbers by placing a wager on the outside common corner of the boxes on the Roulette layout that contains the first number in each of the rows being selected.
7. "Column" is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of 12 numbers contained in a single column on the Roulette layout selected by the player. The player shall select a column of 12 numbers by placing a wager in the box on the Roulette layout that is at the bottom of the column being selected.
8. "Dozen" is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of 12 consecutive numbers from "1" through "12", "13" through "24", or "25" through "36" selected by the player. The player shall select the 12

numbers by placing a wager in the box on the Roulette layout labeled “1st 12” (“1” through “12”), “2nd 12” (“13” through “24”), or “3rd 12” (“25” through “36”).

9. “Red” is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in any compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to a number with a red background on the Roulette wheel. The player shall bet on “red” by placing a wager within the red box on the Roulette layout used for such wagers.
10. “Black” is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in any compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to a number with a black background on the Roulette wheel. The player shall bet on “black” by placing a wager within the black box on the Roulette layout used for such wagers.
11. “Odd” is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in any compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to an odd number. The player shall bet on “Odd” by placing a wager within the box on the Roulette layout that is labeled “Odd”.
12. “Even” is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in any compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to an even number. The player shall bet on “Even” by placing a wager within the box on the Roulette layout that is labeled “Even”.
13. “1 to 18” is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of 18 consecutive numbers from “1” through “18”. The player shall bet on “1 to 18” by placing a wager within the box on the Roulette layout that is labeled “1 to 18”.
14. “19 to 36” is a wager that the Roulette ball will come to rest in a compartment of the Roulette wheel that corresponds to any one of 18 consecutive numbers from “19” through “36”. The player shall bet on “19 to 36” by placing a wager within the box on the Roulette layout that is labeled “19 to 36”.

The wager amounts for the game:

- Per Straight: \$1 - \$10
- Per Split: \$1 - \$10
- Per Three Numbers: \$1 - \$10
- Per Four Numbers: \$1 - \$10
- Per First Five Numbers: \$1 - \$10
- Per Six Numbers: \$1 - \$10
- Per Column: \$5 - \$10
- Per Dozen: \$5 - \$10
- Red: \$5 - \$10
- Black: \$5 - \$10
- Odd: \$5 - \$10
- Even: \$5 - \$10
- 1 to 18: \$5 - \$10
- 19 to 36: \$5 - \$10
