Texas Hold Em Tournament



Object of the Game:

Players will compete to accumulate chips from one another. Cash prizes will be distributed between 1-10 players based on the number of buy ins.

Rules of the game:

This tournament will comply with all house rules and the rules governed by the Tournament Directors Association.

Players will be made aware of the prize pool distribution, rules and regulations of the room by posted material on site.

Players will receive starting chips and a seat assignment upon paying an entry fee. They will be made aware of rebuy options before they begin playing if rebuy options are available.

Equipment:

Each dealer will be issued starting chips for ten players, two different colored decks of cards, a cut card and a rebuy tracking sheet.

Method of play:

The two players to the left of the dealer button put out blind bets. The player directly left of the dealer button posts the small blind while the player two positions left of the dealer button posts the big blind.

Every player receives two cards face down. These are called hole or pocket cards.

The first action falls on the player to the left of the big blind, who can either call the bet, raise it or fold it. Betting continues around the table clockwise.

After the betting is completed, three cards are dealt face up in the center of the table. The first three cards in hold em are called the flop. These cards are community cards meaning everyone can use them in combination with their own two cards to make the best poker hand possible.

From the flop betting begins with the player to the dealers left who can check or bet.

A fourth card is dealt face up on the center of the table. This card is referred to as the turn card.

Another round of betting.

The final card is dealt face up on the center of the table. This card is referred to as the river card.

A final round of betting occurs. The remaining players show their cards and the person who can make the best five card hand by combining their pocket cards with the community cards wins.

Buy Ins and wagers:

The tournament buy ins are variable and will change with the daily tournament. These amounts will be posted on site.

Betting for all texas hold em tournaments will be no limit unless specified otherwise.
