BINGO PARI RULE OF THE MONTH:

Pari 1008.03(o) – States that when a lighted game board and mixing machine are in use, prior to the first bingo game of the day, the caller shall announce that all of the balls are in the rack and are available for inspection by anyone who wishes to inspect the system.

LUCKY 7 PARI RULE OF THE MONTH:

Pari 1105.02(a)(2) – States that each licensed manufacturer of lucky 7 tickets shall only supply lucky 7 tickets and related supplies, equipment and ticket dispensing devices to licensed distributors.

GAMES OF CHANCE LOT RULE OF THE MONTH:

Lot 7207.04(j)(7) – States that a separate bank account shall be established for each promotional account, and at no time shall bank fees be deducted from the balance.



GAMES OF CHANCE (GOC)

GAMES OF CHANCE APPLICATIONS

Anyone (charitable organization or operator) who needs to renew a license or obtain a new games of chance license MUST submit the following documents to the NH Lottery Commission:

- A correctly completed application charitable organization, secondary game operator, primary game operator, game operator employer or GOC facility - along with all supporting documentation.
- A signed and notarized Criminal Record Release Authorization Form (form can be found on our website at: https://www.racing.nh.gov/licensing/games-chance/documents/chrirequest-form.pdf).
- A money order or check for the license fee made payable to: NH Lottery Commission
- Please **DO NOT** send payment for State Police or proof of fingerprinting at this time.

When all documents are received and in order, the NH Lottery licensing unit will issue a license which will be contingent upon the individual completing fingerprinting requirements at a future time.

Within 30-days of the termination of the State of Emergency - Executive Order, each applicant MUST complete the fingerprinting requirement (ink card or livescan site form) of the criminal record check. Once the applicant has had their prints taken, all proof of fingerprinting documents will then need to be submitted to the NH Lottery Commission, along with a check or money order in the amount of \$48.25 (made payable to: State of NH - Criminal Records). If an applicant does not meet the 30-day deadline, their license will expire on the 31st day.

Upon receipt of the criminal history results, the NH Lottery licensing unit will either (1) grant full license status for the remainder of the license period for applicants with a clean criminal history, or (2) deem the license expired for all applicants whose criminal history disqualify them for licensure. All applicants that are subsequently denied a license may appeal the decision as permitted by RSA 541-A.

In an effort to help prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the NH Lottery Commission is not accepting submissions by hand-delivery at this time. Please submit all applications by mail.
